

Crime in Alabama

Crime in Alabama 2009 represents a summary of the nature and extent of the crimes reported by local criminal justice agencies to the Alabama Criminal Justice Information Center's (ACJIC) Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) program. State law mandates that all crimes are reported from state, county and local law enforcement agencies, and the statistics presented in this report are compiled from these reports.

Since the UCR program is designed to provide a snapshot of criminal activity in a specific geographical area rather than as a measure of a law enforcement agency's response to crime, it should not be used to evaluate or compare one agency with another. UCR is only one aspect of the activities and responsibilities of the law enforcement community, and the statistics presented herein are not intended to serve as the sole indicator of either the workload or effectiveness of the reporting agencies.

Preface

The 2009 Crime in Alabama report is intended to inform law enforcement officials and private citizens of criminal and law enforcement activity in Alabama. Since the UCR offense and arrest data are the basis of this report, it must be noted that other factors affecting crime are not measured by UCR, such as age, sex, and race of the population, economic conditions of the area, transient population, culture, education, climate, attitudes of the victims toward crime and police, and crime reporting practices of the citizens. Therefore, it is difficult to draw conclusions or make valid comparisons between various jurisdictions by using only the crime and arrest data in this book. The data in this book are used for analyzing crime problems inherent in the criminal justice system and as a foundation for planning and budgeting. Geographic areas covered in this report include the State of Alabama, county and city strata.

We would like to extend our appreciation to law enforcement agencies – sheriff's departments, municipal police departments, and campus police – for their cooperation in the UCR program.

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Introduction

In October of 1975, Act 872 passed both houses of the Alabama Legislature creating and establishing the Alabama Criminal Justice Information Center (ACJIC) which is commissioned to collect, store, retrieve, analyze, and disseminate criminal justice data. Inherent in ACJIC is a "uniform crime reporting system for the periodic collection and analysis of crimes reported to any and all criminal justice agencies within the state." (Act 872, Section 9, 1975)

With the passage of this bill, mandatory reporting was required of law enforcement agencies in Alabama. Prior to 1976, law enforcement agencies participated in the FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting Program (UCR) on a voluntary basis. Since mandatory submission, there has been a 185% increase in UCR reporting.

Alabama's UCR program functions in accordance with the FBI's standards of operation which specify a uniform data collection device and quality control procedures which provide viable crime statistics for accurate indication of crime and crime trends.

ACJIC implemented an incident based reporting system as an alternative to UCR summary reporting in 1977. This Incident Based Reporting (IBR) System also provides a self-contained internal record keeping system for the agency. IBR is a voluntary system with 99% of Alabama's agencies participating. This reporting program is more detailed providing greater potential for services, analyses, and resource studies by both the individual agency's crime analysis units and ACJIC.

In 1986, ACJIC organized a 32-person UCR Committee to review the IBR report forms. This committee was made up of law enforcement personnel from small, medium and large police departments and sheriff's departments, computerized agencies, the FBI, and the Bureau of Justice Statistics (BJS). The committee reviewed and analyzed the ten year old forms and decided that enhancements were needed. The IBR report forms were redesigned with input from Alabama's local agencies. In 2006, these forms were re-designed to conform to the FBI's Nation Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS).

Alabama's law enforcement agencies are supplied with monthly reporting forms by ACJIC's Field Agents who are also made available to the reporting agencies to help answer any questions which may arise regarding forms, crime classifications, and clearance data. The Field Agents are also responsible for training law enforcement personnel and maintaining the quality of information for output to the criminal justice system. Agencies may also request free software from ACJIC to record and report incident/offense and arrest activities.

Alabama's law enforcement community can be proud of the progress made in the incident reporting program. Because of the support and dedication of our law enforcement Alabama is one of the states leading the way for a national IBR system.

Crime and Arrest Data

Valid crime data can provide a solid foundation for statistical analyses, management-oriented analyses and crime breakdowns. These analyses can then aid local police departments in laying out patrol districts, assigning patrol units, and designating community education programs.

Data used in this report are provided by the Crime Statistics and Information Division of the Alabama Criminal Justice Information Center (ACJIC). ACJIC's data center houses the official state repository for reported arrests and offenses, and the CSI Division has the responsibility of collecting and disseminating crime data. In 2009, approximately 350 agencies reported known offenses to Alabama's UCR; 99% of Alabama's law enforcement agencies submitted Incident Reports and 1% returned UCR Summaries.

Through a mandate of Congress, Arson is counted as a Part I Offense. So as not to distort crime trends in Total and Property Crime indices, Arson totals will not be included in these sections but will be included in a separate section following property crimes.

Crime data are obtained from the Part I Index of Offenses submitted by law enforcement agencies to Alabama's UCR program. These Part I Offenses are divided into Violent Crime and Property Crimes.

Violent Crimes include Homicide, Rape, Robbery, and Assault. These crimes are considered violent inasmuch as they are offenses perpetrated against a person(s) with a high risk or injury or death to the victim(s). Property Crimes are comprised of Burglary, Larceny, Motor Vehicle Theft, and Arson*. Property or Nonviolent Crimes lack the aspect of force and/or bodily harm to the victim(s).

Clearance and arrest data are also reported to Alabama's UCR. A crime is considered cleared, either by arrest or by exceptional means, when enough evidence is found to charge a suspect and take him/her into custody. It is conceivable that one arrest could clear several offenses or that several arrests could clear one offense. The clearance rate is achieved by taking the number of clearances over the number of crimes reported:

$$\text{CLEARANCE RATE} = \frac{\text{REPORTED CRIME}}{\text{CLEARANCES}}$$

This report is a composite picture of crime and law enforcement activity in Alabama for 2009. It provides a breakdown for the State and localities participating in the UCR program. The report concentrates on the Index Crime of the FBI's Part I Offenses and offers tabular and narrative formats for comparisons, trends, rates, and percent changes.

*A separate section on arson will be included in this report.

Definition of Terms

Term	Definition
Adult	the UCR system defines adults as 18 years of age and over.
Arrest	a measure of law enforcement activity by which an individual is detained in legal custody.
Arson	willful or malicious burning with or without intent to defraud, includes attempts.
Assault	the unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe bodily injury, including attempts. Attempted homicide is listed as an aggravated assault.
Burglary	unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or theft.
Central City	a city with at least 50,000 residents.
City Strata	a breakdown of cities according to population.
Clearance	a measure of law enforcement activity which shows that a crime has been solved for a crime reporting purposes either by the arrest of a suspect or by exceptional means. Exceptional means provides a solution to a crime when there is enough evidence to place a formal charge against an offender, but some element beyond law enforcement control precludes an actual arrest. It is possible for one arrest to clear more than one offense.
Clearance Rate	the clearance rate is achieved by taking the number of clearances over the number of crimes reported.
Crime Rate	a measure of criminal activity which shows the number of crimes reported per 100,000 residents.
Criminal Activity	measured by reported crimes, trends, rates.
Forcible Entry	offenses in which force of any kind is used to unlawfully enter a structure for the purpose of committing a theft or felony.
Hierarchy of Offenses	whenever more than one offense is committed simultaneously, the most severe offense is reported to UCR. The exception is arson which is always reported along with the most serious offense.
Homicide	the willful killing of another as based on police investigation.
Incident Based Reporting (IBR) System	a voluntary crime reporting system developed by ACJIC as an alternative to the UCR Summary Program.
Juveniles	the UCR system defines juveniles as males and females 17 years of age and younger.
Larceny	unlawful taking or stealing of property or articles without the use of force, violence or fraud, i.e., pocket picking, purse snatching, shoplifting, theft from vending machines, etc.
Law Enforcement Activity	police activity as measured by clearances and arrests.

Minimal Injury	personal injury involving abrasions, minor lacerations requiring no more than usual first-aid treatment.
Motor Vehicles	automobiles, trucks, buses, motorcycles, etc.
Motor Vehicle Theft	The unlawful taking or stealing of a motor vehicle, including attempts.
Non-Residence	any structure used for purposes other than a residence.
Part I Index Crimes	a category of UCR offenses deemed more serious and/or most frequent. The Part I Index Crimes include homicide, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft, and arson.
Part II Offenses	<p>a category of UCR offenses which include:</p> <p>Assaults (Simple): non-aggravated assaults.</p> <p>Forgery and Counterfeiting - making, altering, uttering, or possessing with intent to defraud, anything false which is made to appear true, includes attempts.</p> <p>Fraud: fraudulent conversion and obtaining money or property by false pretenses.</p> <p>Embezzlement: misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody, or control.</p> <p>Stolen Property: buying, receiving, and possessing stolen property, includes attempts.</p> <p>Vandalism: willful or malicious destruction, injury, disfigurement or defacement of property without the consent of the owner or person having custody or control.</p> <p>Weapons: all violations of regulations or statutes controlling the carrying, using, possessing, furnishing and manufacturing of deadly weapons or silencers, includes attempts.</p> <p>Prostitution and Commercialized Vice: sex offenses of a commercial nature.</p> <p>Sex Offenses (Other): statutory rape, offenses against chastity, common decency, morals, etc.</p> <p>Narcotic Drug Laws: offenses relating to narcotics, i.e., possession, sale, use, growing and manufacturing of narcotic drugs.</p> <p>Gambling: promoting, permitting, or engaging in illegal gambling.</p> <p>Offenses Against the Family and Children: non-support, neglect, desertion, or abuse of family and children.</p> <p>Driving Under the Influence: driving or operating any motor vehicle or common carrier while drunk or under the influence of liquor or narcotics.</p> <p>Liquor Laws: violations of state or local liquor laws.</p> <p>Drunkness: drunkenness or intoxication.</p> <p>Disorderly conduct: breach of the peace.</p> <p>Vagrancy: begging, loitering, etc.</p> <p>All other offenses: all violations of state or local laws, except categories mentioned above, Part I Offenses, and traffic violations. Including, but not limited to bigamy, blackmail, bribery, contempt of court, discrimination, perjury, possession and/or sale of obscene material,</p>

	quarantine violations, etc.
Property Crimes	(non-violent crimes) index crimes which lack the aspect of force and/or bodily harm to the victim(s). Included in this category are burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft, and arson.
Recovery	finding stolen property. It should be noted that a recovered article does not clear a crime, although the owner is reunited with his property a crime was committed and a suspect must be taken into custody to clear the offense.
Reported Crimes	crimes reported to law enforcement officials. <i>Note: In this report, only those offenses which prove to be actual offenses are used. Those cases which have been deemed unfounded are excluded from the crime totals.</i>
Residence	any dwelling structure used for human habitation.
Robbery	stealing or taking anything from the care, custody, or control of a person, in his presence, by force or by threat of force, including attempts. Robbery is broken down into seven categories: Highway: robberies occurring on the streets, in alleys, outside of structures. Commercial House: hotels, motels, lodging houses, etc. Gas or Service Stations: sell gasoline and related products. Convenience Stores: neighborhood stores which specialize in the sale of consumable items. Residence: robberies occurring in a dwelling or on the premises. Banking Establishments - banks, savings & loan institutions, credit unions, etc. Miscellaneous: churches, temples, schools, union halls, government buildings, public transit systems, etc.
Serious Injury	personal injury is considered serious if there are broken bones, internal injuries, or if stitches are required.
Uniform Crime Reports	standardized reporting forms used by law enforcement officials to report criminal activity within their jurisdiction.
Uniform Crime Reporting System	official state repository of the Uniform Crime Reports and Incident Reporting forms and provides for the collection and dissemination of crime data.
Unlawful Entry	involves no force and is achieved by use of an unlocked door or window. The element of trespass is essential.
Urbanized Areas	incorporated or unincorporated places of 2,500 or more inhabitants.
Violent Crimes	index crimes which are offenses perpetrated against a person (or persons) with a high risk of injury or death to the victim. Crimes included in this category are homicide, rape, robbery, and assault.

Total Index Crime

Total Index Crime is comprised of the Part I Offenses: Homicide, Rape, Robbery, Assault, Burglary, Larceny, Motor Vehicle Theft, and Arson.* Both offense and arrest data are collected for Part I crime.

Alabama Crime - 2009 Summary Offense Data

- There were **189,857** crimes reported in 2009, a **6%** decrease from 2008.
- The crime rate for the state was **4,032.0** per 100,000 inhabitants.
- On a daily average, there were **520** Part I offenses reported.
- The total property value stolen in 2009 was **\$216,561,931**; **12%** was recovered.
- There were **249** Law Enforcement Officers assaulted in 2009. On the average, less than one officer was assaulted per day in 2009. **59%** received serious injuries and **41%** received minimal or no injuries.





Clearance and Arrest Data


- There were **36,666** clearances in 2009, providing a clearance rate of **19%**.
- A total of **33,111** persons were arrested for Part I offenses.* Part I arrests made up **15%** of all arrests in Alabama in 2009.
- Juveniles made up **14%** of the Part I arrests, males made up **67%** of persons arrested for Part I offenses, **50%** of those arrested for Part I offenses were black and **50%** were white.
- A total of **185,588** people were arrested for Part II offenses; **4%** of Part II arrests were juveniles. Males made up **74%** of Part II arrests. Whites made up **56%** and blacks, **44%** of Part II arrests.
- A total of **17,156** people were arrested for narcotic drug violations. **12%** were for sale and **88%** for possession. **95%** were adult and **5%** juvenile.
- There were **30,241** people arrested for alcohol violations: **50%** were arrested for driving under the influence; **18%** were arrested for liquor law violations; and **32%** for public drunkenness. **97%** of the alcohol arrests were adults and **3%** were juveniles.



Property Crime

Property Crime is comprised of Burglary, Larceny, Motor Vehicle Theft, and Arson.* These crimes are designated as non-violent crimes because they lack the aspect of force and/or bodily harm to the victim(s).

Property Crime Summary 2009

- In 2009 there were **169,690** property crimes reported. This is a **6%** decrease from 2008. Property crime makes up **89%** of the total Index offenses.
- The property crime rate was **3,603.7** per 100,000 inhabitants. On the average there were **464.9** property crimes reported per day.
- A total of **29,564** property crimes were cleared in 2009 for a **17%** clearance rate.
- In 2009, **26,493** people were arrested for property crimes: **85%** were adults; **53%** were white; and **62%** were males.
- Total property value stolen in 2009 was **\$216,561,931**; **12%** was recovered.





Violent Crime is comprised of Homicide, Rape, Robbery, and Assault. These crimes are designated as Violent Crimes because they are offenses perpetrated against a person (or persons) with a high risk of injury or death to the victim.

Violent Crime Summary 2009


- There were **20,167** Violent Crimes reported in 2009, a **1%** decrease from 2008. Violent crime makes up **11%** of the total Index offenses.
- The violent crime rate was **428.3** per 100,000 inhabitants.
- On the average, there were **55.3** violent crimes reported per day.
- There were **7,102** violent crimes cleared in 2009 for a **35%** clearance rate.
- In 2009, **6,672** people were arrested for Violent Crimes: **89%** were adults; **39%** were white; and, **82%** were male.

Homicide

Murder and non-negligent manslaughter is the willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another. Not included in the count for this offense classification are deaths caused by negligence, suicide, accident, justifiable homicides which are the killings of felons by law enforcement officers in the line of duty or by private citizens; and attempts to murder or assaults to murder, which are scored as aggravated assaults.

- There were **318** homicides in Alabama in 2009 representing a **7%** decrease from 2008.
- The homicide rate was **6.8** per 100,000 inhabitants, with an average of less than **1** homicide per day. **197** homicides were cleared for a **62%** clearance rate.
- There were **351** persons arrested for homicide: **9%** were juveniles; **91%** were males; and **36%** were white.
- The age group with the greatest number of homicide victims was 20-30, comprising **37%** of the homicide victims. **46%** had black victims and black offenders; **18%** had white victims and white offenders, **2%** black victim and white offender, **3%** white victim and black offender, and in **30%**, the race of the offender was unknown.
- Handguns were used in **61%** of all homicides, knives in **9%**, hands, fists or feet in **6%**, and other firearms, such as rifles and shotguns, in **10%**.
- **22%** of homicide victims were related to the offender, and **26%** were acquainted with the offender. **12%** of the victims were killed by strangers and in **40%** the relationship was unknown. In **6%** of all homicides the victim and offender were boyfriend/girlfriend, and **13%** of all homicides were domestic in 2009.
- **15%** of the homicides were a result of an argument, **26%** of the homicides occurred during the commission of a felony, and in **58%** of the homicides the circumstances were unknown.
- **19%** of all homicides occurred on a Friday. **56%** occurred at a residence while **24%** occurred on a highway, street or in an alley.

Rape

Rape is the carnal knowledge of a female through force or the threat of force, includes attempts.*

- **1,428** rapes were reported in Alabama in 2009. This is a **6%** decrease from 2008.
- The rape rate was **58.3** per 100,000 females.
- **515** rapes were cleared for a **36%** clearance rate.
- On the average, there were **4** rapes reported per day in 2009.
- **394** males were arrested for rape with **7%** being juveniles. White males made up **48%** of rape arrests. **29.2** is the average age of the rape offender with a range from 12 to 73 years.
- **22.8** is the average age of the rape victim with a range from 2 to 89 years. **58%** of the rape victims in Alabama were white females; **41%** were black females, and **1%** were other or unknown. **32%** of all rape victims were 13, 14, 15, and 16-year-olds.
- In **70%** of the rapes, the victim and offender knew or were related to each other; in **8%** the victim and offender were strangers; and in **22%** the relationship was unknown.
- **32%** of the rapes involved a white victim and white offender; **11%** a white victim and black offender; **35%** a black victim and black offender; **1%** a black victim and white offender. In **21%** the race of the offender was unknown or other.
- In **81%** of the rapes, hand, fists and/or verbal threats were used to exert force upon a victim; guns were used in **6%**, and knives in **3%** of the rapes.
- **33%** of the rapes occurred in the victim's residence; **16%** in the offender's residence; **3%** in the offender's vehicle; and **8%** at the residence of a friend or relative of the victim or the offender. **21%** of rapes occurred on a Saturday and **16%** on a Sunday.
- **79%** of victims reported no other injuries from the rape and **40%** submitted to a medical exam.



Robbery

Robbery is the stealing or taking anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person, in his presence, by force or by threat of force, includes attempts.

- There were **6,052** robberies reported in 2009, a **14%** decrease from 2008.
- The robbery rate was **128.5** per 100,000 inhabitants. On the average, there were **16.6** robberies reported per day in 2009.
- There were **1,761** robberies cleared for a **29%** clearance rate.
- **1,873** persons were arrested for robbery: **20%** were juveniles; **23%** were white; and **89%** were males.
- In **63%** of the robberies a firearm was used; **22%** were strong arm; in **5%** a knife or cutting instrument was used; and in **10%** other dangerous weapons were used. In **84%** of the robberies the victim was not injured.

Assault

Assault is the unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe bodily injury, includes attempts.

- There were **12,369** aggravated assaults reported in 2009 for a **7%** increase over 2008.
- There were **262.7** assaults per 100,000 inhabitants. On the average, there were **33.9** assaults reported per day. **4,629** assaults were cleared for a **37%** clearance rate.
- **4,054** people were arrested for aggravated assaults in 2009: **7%** were juvenile, **77%** were male and **45%** were white.
- **32%** of the assaults were a result of firearms; **23%** other dangerous weapons; **17%** knives; and, **28%** hands and fists. **49%** of the victims were injured.

Burglary

Burglary is the unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft, includes forcible entry, unlawful entry and attempted forcible entry.

- There were **46,658** burglaries reported in 2009, a **2%** decrease from 2008.
- There were **990.9** burglaries per 100,000 inhabitants. On the average, there were **127.8** burglaries reported per day.
- **5,064** burglaries were cleared for an **11%** clearance rate.
- **4,762** persons were arrested for burglary: **19%** juveniles; **90%** males; and **46%** white.
- **72%** of the burglaries were forcible entry, **26%** were unlawful entries, and **2%** were attempted forcible entry. In **61%** of burglaries the point of entry was a door; in **21%** a window; and in **18%** the point of entry was other.

Larceny is the unlawful taking or stealing of property or articles without the use of force, violence and fraud.

- **112,428** larcenies were reported in 2009 for a **7%** decrease from 2008.
- The larceny rate was **2,387.7** per 100,000 inhabitants.
- **22,634** larcenies were cleared for a **20%** clearance rate. On the average, there were **308.0** larcenies reported per day.
- There were **20,682** persons arrested for larceny in 2009: **14%** were juveniles; **54%** were males, and **55%** were white.
- **22%** of the larcenies were thefts of items from motor vehicles; **14%** were shoplifting, and **11%** were theft of items from buildings.

Motor Vehicle Theft

Motor Vehicle Theft is the unlawful taking or stealing of a motor vehicle, includes attempts.

- There were **10,604** motor vehicle thefts reported in 2009 for a **16%** decrease from 2008.
- The motor vehicle theft rate for Alabama in 2009 was **225.2** thefts for every 100,000 inhabitants. On the average, there were **29.1** motor vehicles stolen per day.
- A total of **1,866** motor vehicle thefts were cleared for a clearance rate of **18%**.
- A total of **995** people were arrested in 2009 for motor vehicle theft: **12%** were juveniles; **78%** were males; and, **53%** were white. **44%** of the juveniles arrested were below the legal driving age of 16.
- The dollar value resulting from locally stolen motor vehicles was **\$60,966,877**. The value recovered was **\$18,210,021** or **30%**.

Arson

Arson is the willful or malicious burning with or without intent to defraud, includes attempts. It should be noted that the hierarchy rule does not apply to arson, meaning that any offense(s) committed in conjunction with arson results in the most serious offense, as well as the arson incident, being reported to UCR.

- A total of **344** arsons were reported in 2009. This represents a **15%** decrease from 2008. **70%** were structural arsons, **29%** were motor vehicles and other mobile property, and **1%** were other.
- There were **38** arsons cleared in 2009 for an **11%** clearance rate.
- On the average, there was less than **1** arson reported per day.
- There were **142** people arrested for arson: **17%** were juveniles; **74%** were males; and **59%** were white.
- In **12%** of the structural arsons, the building was uninhabited or not normally in use.


- A total of **185,588** persons were arrested in Alabama in 2009 for Part II offenses (includes arson arrests).
- This is a decrease of **7%** over 2008's figure of 198,881.
- **56%** of Part II arrestees were white and **44%** were black.
- **96%** of the Part II arrests were adults.
- Males made up **74%** of Part II arrests.
- Liquor violations (DUI, drunkenness, liquor laws violations) made up **16%** of the Part II arrests. Narcotics violations made up **9%** of the Part II arrests.

Liquor Violations

- There were **30,241** people arrested for alcohol violations in 2009.
- **15,231** people were arrested for DUI with **99%** being 18 and over. **79%** of the DUI arrests were males, **77%** of DUI arrests were white.
- There were **5,444** people arrested for liquor laws violations (bootlegging, buying or selling to minors, etc.) **11%** were juveniles, **78%** were males and **81%** were white.
- There were **9,566** people arrested in 2009 for public drunkenness. **1%** were juveniles. **82%** were males and **76%** were white.

Drug Abuse Violations

Drug abuse violations involve the illegal sale, possession, manufacture, use, cultivation, etc. of narcotic and non-narcotic drugs.

Illegal drugs are divided into four categories:

1. Opium or cocaine and their derivatives such as morphine, heroin, codeine, and "crack".
2. Marijuana.
3. Synthetic narcotics which are manufactured narcotics which cause true drug addiction such as demerol and methadone.
4. Dangerous non-narcotic drugs which include barbiturates, amphetamines and methamphetamine.

- There were **17,156** persons arrested for drug violations, **12%** were for sale of drugs and **88%** were for possession.
- **5%** of the drug arrests were juveniles, **82%** were males and **42%** were white.
- Marijuana possession resulted in the greatest number of arrests for drug violations, **9,166** for **53%** of the drug arrests. Possession of cocaine resulted in **3,633** arrests, or **21%** of all drug arrests.







Full Time University Police Department Personnel



Assaulted

In 2009 there were **249** law enforcement officers assaulted in the line of duty. **148** officers, or **59%**, received serious injuries. The remainder received minimal or no injuries.

Hands, fists or feet were used in **191** assaults or **77%** of the incidents. Firearms were used in **6** cases or **2%**.




