

Family Violence in Alabama

Family Violence in Alabama 2006 – 2010 represents a summary of the nature and extent of the family violence crimes reported by local criminal justice agencies to the Alabama Criminal Justice Information Center's (ACJIC) Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) program. State law mandates that all crimes are reported from state, county and local law enforcement agencies, and the statistics presented in this report are compiled from these reports.

Since the UCR program is designed to provide a snapshot of criminal activity in a specific geographical area rather than as a measure of a law enforcement agency's response to crime, it should not be used to evaluate or compare one agency with another. UCR is only one aspect of the activities and responsibilities of the law enforcement community, and the statistics presented herein are not intended to serve as the sole indicator of either the workload or effectiveness of the reporting agencies.

Preface

The *Family Violence in Alabama 2006 – 2010* report is intended to inform law enforcement officials and private citizens of criminal and law enforcement activity in Alabama. Since the UCR offense and arrest data are the basis of this report, it must be noted that other factors affecting crime are not measured by UCR, such as age, sex, and race of the population, economic conditions of the area, transient population, culture, education, climate, attitudes of the victims toward crime and police, and crime reporting practices of the citizens. Therefore, it is difficult to draw conclusions or make valid comparisons between various jurisdictions by using only the crime and arrest data in this book. The data in this book are used for analyzing crime problems inherent in the criminal justice system and as a foundation for planning and budgeting. Geographic areas covered in this report include the State of Alabama, county and city strata.

For the purpose of this report, family violence is indicated when the victim and offender are related by either blood or marriage, including husband, wife, ex-husband, ex-wife, common-law husband, common-law wife, father, mother, sister, brother, son, daughter, step-father, step-mother, step-son, step-daughter, in-law, or other family.

We would like to extend our appreciation to law enforcement agencies – sheriff's departments, municipal police departments, and campus police – for their cooperation in the UCR program.

Family Violence Total

Total Family Violent Crime is comprised of the violent Part I Offenses: Homicide, Rape, Robbery, and Aggravated Assault. Simple assault is not included in the violent crime total, but is included in this report in its own category.

- There were **11,716** crimes of family violence reported between 2006 and 2010 (excluding simple assaults), representing **12%** of the **97,652** total violent offenses reported for those years. Family violence was indicated in **220** homicides, **1,041** rapes, **341** robberies and **10,114** aggravated assaults for the five year time period.
- There were **118,531** family violence simple assaults reported during the five year period. Simple assault is not included in the violent crime totals.
- Based on the family violence offenses reported in 2010, the crime rate for family violence for the state was **50.3** per 100,000 inhabitants. On average, there were **6.4** family violence offenses reported per day. **48%** of family violence incidents were cleared, and **34%** of the clearances were exceptional (lack of prosecution, etc.).
- There were **2,096 juvenile victims** of family violence from 2006-2010, representing **18%** of all family violence victims. **8%** of family violence offenders were juveniles. There were **585** victims of family violence **over the age of 59** during the five year period, representing **5%** of all family violence victims. **4%** of family violence offenders were over the age of 59.
- **59%** of family violence victims were female, and **41%** were male. **55%** of family violence victims were white, **44%** were black, and **1%** of victims were of another race or their race was unknown. **70%** of family violence offenders were male, **21%** were female and **9%** were unknown. **46%** of family violence offenders were white, **40%** were black, and **14%** were other or unknown.
- Handguns were used in **18%** of the family violence, knives in **15%**, hands, fists or feet in **46%**, and other dangerous weapons in **21%**. **42%** of family violence victims reported injuries.
- **24%** of the family violence victims were the wife, common-law wife, or ex-wife of the offender. **9%** of the victims were the husband, common-law husband, or ex-husband of the offender. **9%** of the victims were the father or mother of the offender, **11%** were the son or daughter, **12%** were the brother or sister, **7%** were a step relative, **6%** were an in-law, and **22%** of the family violence victims were other family.
- **85%** of family violence crimes occurred at a residence while **6%** occurred on a highway, street or in an alley, **2%** occurred in a parking lot, **1%** occurred at other commercial locations, and **6%** occurred in all other locations.





Family Violence - Homicide

Murder and non-negligent manslaughter is the willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another. Not included in the count for this offense classification are deaths caused by negligence, suicide, accident, justifiable homicides which are the killings of felons by law enforcement officers in the line of duty or by private citizens; and attempts to murder or assaults to murder, which are scored as aggravated assaults.

- There were **220** family violence related homicides in Alabama from 2006 to 2010 representing **13%** of the **1,659** total homicides reported during that time frame.
- The family violence homicide rate was **.9** per 100,000 inhabitants, based on the latest reporting year of 2010. **175** family violence homicides were cleared for an **80%** clearance rate.
- There were **21 juvenile victims** of family violence homicide from 2006-2010, representing **10%** of all family violence homicides. **3%** of family violence homicide offenders were juveniles.
- There were **25** victims of family violence homicide **over the age of 59** from 2006-2010, representing **11%** of all family violence homicides. **8%** of family violence homicide offenders were over the age of 59.
- **48%** of the homicide victims were female, and **52%** were male. **59%** of the homicide victims were white, **38%** were black, and **3%** of victims were of another race. **75%** of homicide offenders were male, **16%** were female and **9%** were unknown. **48%** of family violence offenders were white, **37%** were black, and **15%** were other or unknown.
- Handguns were used in **70%** of the family violence homicides, knives in **13%**, hands, fists or feet in **7%**, and other dangerous weapons in **10%**.
- **31%** of the homicide victims were the wife, common-law wife, or ex-wife of the offender. **11%** of the homicide victims were the husband, common-law husband, or ex-husband of the offender. **11%** of the homicide victims were the father or mother of the offender, **12%** were the son or daughter, **9%** were the brother or sister, **4%** were a step relative, **5%** were an in-law, and **17%** of the homicide victims were other family.
- **83%** of family violence homicides occurred at a residence while **5%** occurred on a highway, street or in an alley, **1%** occurred in a parking lot, and **11%** occurred in all other locations.





Family Violence - Rape

Rape is the carnal knowledge of a female through force or the threat of force, including attempts.

- There were **1,041** family violence related rapes in Alabama from 2006 to 2010 representing **15%** of the **7,080** total rapes reported during that time frame.
- The family violence rape rate was **7.5** per 100,000 female inhabitants, based on the latest reporting year of 2010. **428** family violence rapes were cleared for a **41%** clearance rate. **39%** of the clearances were exceptional (lack of prosecution, etc).
- There were **569 juvenile victims** of family violence rape from 2006-2010, representing **55%** of all family violence rapes. **33%** of family violence rape victims were in the 12-16 age groups, and the single largest number of victims was in the 14-year-old age group, which comprised **8%** of all family violence rapes. Only **9%** of family violence rape offenders were juveniles.
- There were **7** victims of family violence rape **over the age of 59** from 2006-2010, representing **1%** of all family violence rape. **4%** of family violence rape offenders were over the age 59.
- **59%** of the family violence rape victims were white females, **40%** were black females, and **1%** were of another race. **46%** of the offenders were white males, **37%** of the offenders were black males, and **17%** were of another race or unknown.
- Handguns were used in **4%** of the family violence rapes, knives in **2%**, hands, fists or feet in **84%**, and other dangerous weapons in **10%**. **31%** of the victims reported additional injuries.
- **22%** of the rape victims were the wife, common-law wife, or ex-wife of the offender. **15%** of the rape victims were the daughter of the offender and **17%** were the step-daughter. **6%** of the rape victims were the sister of the offender, **3%** were an in-law, and **37%** of the rape victims were other family.
- **89%** of family violence rapes occurred at a residence while **1%** occurred on a highway, street or in an alley, **1%** occurred in a parking lot, and **9%** occurred in all other locations.






Family Violence - Robbery

Robbery is the stealing or taking anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person, in his presence, by force or by threat of force, includes attempts.

- There were **341** family violence related robberies in Alabama from 2006 to 2010 representing **1%** of the **31,252** total robberies reported during that time frame.
- The family violence robbery rate was **.9** per 100,000 inhabitants, based on the latest reporting year of 2010. **138** family violence robberies were cleared for a **40%** clearance rate. **46%** of the clearances were exceptional (lack of prosecution, etc).
- There were **11 juvenile victims** of family violence robbery from 2006-2010, representing **3%** of all family violence robberies. **4%** of family violence robbery offenders were juveniles.
- There were **50** victims of family violence robbery **over the age of 59** from 2006-2010, representing **15%** of all family violence robberies. **0%** of family violence robbery offenders were over the age of 59.
- **38%** of the robbery victims were female, and **62%** were male. **49%** of the robbery victims were white, **45%** were black, and **6%** of victims were of another race. **61%** of robbery offenders were male, **11%** were female and **28%** were unknown. **26%** of family violence robbery offenders were white, **43%** were black, and **31%** were other or unknown.
- Handguns were used in **33%** of the family violence robberies, knives in **7%**, hands, fists or feet in **49%**, and other dangerous weapons in **11%**. **23%** of the family violence robbery victims reported injuries.
- **21%** of the robbery victims were the wife, common-law wife, or ex-wife of the offender. **5%** of the robbery victims were the husband, common-law husband, or ex-husband of the offender. **16%** of the robbery victims were the father or mother of the offender, **2%** were the son or daughter, **11%** were the brother or sister, **4%** were a step relative, **4%** were an in-law, and **36%** of the robbery victims were other family.
- **51%** of family violence robberies occurred at a residence while **20%** occurred on a highway, street or in an alley, **6%** occurred in a parking lot, and **23%** occurred in all other locations.





Family Violence – Aggravated Assault

Aggravated assault is the unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe bodily injury, includes attempts.

- There were **10,114** family violence related aggravated assaults in Alabama from 2006 to 2010 representing **18%** of the **57,661** total aggravated assaults reported during that time frame.
- The family violence aggravated assault rate was **44.6** per 100,000 inhabitants, based on the latest reporting year of 2010. **4,918** family violence aggravated assaults were cleared for a **49%** clearance rate. **34%** of the clearances were exceptional (lack of prosecution, etc).
- There were **1,495 juvenile victims** of family violence aggravated assault from 2006-2010, representing **15%** of all family violence aggravated assaults. **8%** of family violence aggravated assault offenders were juveniles.
- There were **503** victims of family violence aggravated assault **over the age of 59** from 2006-2010, representing **5%** of all family violence aggravated assaults. **4%** of family violence aggravated assault offenders were over the age of 59.
- **55%** of the assault victims were female, and **45%** were male. **54%** of the assault victims were white, **44%** were black, and **2%** of victims were of another race.
- **68%** of assault offenders were male, **24%** were female and **8%** were unknown. **47%** of family violence aggravated assault offenders were white, **40%** were black, and **13%** were other or unknown.
- Handguns were used in **17%** of the family violence aggravated assaults, knives in **17%**, hands, fists or feet in **43%**, and other dangerous weapons in **23%**. **43%** of victims reported injuries.
- **24%** of the aggravated assault victims were the wife, common-law wife, or ex-wife of the offender. **10%** of the aggravated assault victims were the husband, common-law husband, or ex-husband of the offender. **9%** of the aggravated assault victims were the father or mother of the offender, **11%** were the son or daughter, **12%** were the brother or sister, **6%** were a step relative, **6%** were an in-law, and **21%** of the aggravated assault victims were other family.
- **86%** of family violence aggravated assaults occurred at a residence while **6%** occurred on a highway, street or in an alley, **2%** occurred in a parking lot, and **6%** occurred in all other locations.

- There were **64** reported incidents of family violence aggravated stalking, which are included in the aggravated assault category. Aggravated stalking is defined as stalking offenses that occur after a protection order is obtained by the victim.
- **78%** of the victims of aggravated stalking were the wife, common-law wife, or ex-wife of the offender. **8%** of the victims were the husband, common-law husband or ex-husband of the offender, **8%** were the son or daughter, and **5%** were the sister of the offender.





Family Violence – Simple Assault

Simple assault is an assault in which the victim did not sustain serious or aggravated injuries, and in which hands, fist or feet are usually the only weapons involved.

- There were **118,531** family violence simple assaults reported between 2006 and 2010, representing **30%** of the simple assaults reported during that time frame. On average there were **65** family violence simple assaults reported per day.
- The family violence simple assault rate for the state was **492.6** per 100,000 inhabitants, based on the latest reporting year of 2010. **53%** of family violence simple assaults were cleared. **40%** of the clearances were exceptional.
- There were **9,220 juvenile victims** of family violence simple assault from 2006-2010, representing **8%** of all family violence simple assaults. **9%** of family violence simple assault offenders were juveniles.
- There were **6,390** victims of family violence simple assault **over the age of 59** from 2006-2010, representing **5%** of all family violence simple assaults. **3%** of family violence simple assault offenders were over the age of 59.
- **72%** of the victims of family violence simple assault were female, and **28%** were male. **61%** of the victims were white, **38%** black, and **1%** were of another race.
- **69%** of simple assault offenders were male, **25%** were female and **6%** were unknown. **53%** of family violence simple assault offenders were white, **37%** were black, and **10%** were other or unknown.
- Handguns were used in **2%** of the family violence simple assaults, knives in **2%**, hands, fists or feet in **88%**, and other dangerous weapons in **8%**. **69%** of family violence simple assault victims reported no injuries, while **31%** reported injuries.
- **38%** of the simple assault victims were the wife, common-law wife, or ex-wife of the offender. **11%** of the simple assault victims were the husband, common-law husband, or ex-husband of the offender. **14%** of the simple assault victims were the father or mother of the offender, **7%** were the son or daughter, **10%** were the brother or sister, **4%** were a step relative, **4%** were an in-law, and **11%** of the simple assault victims were other family.
- **86%** of family violence simple assaults occurred at a residence while **4%** occurred on a highway, street or in an alley, **2%** occurred in a parking lot, and **8%** occurred in all other locations.

- There were **156** reported incidents of family violence simple stalking, which are included in the simple assault category. Simple stalking is defined as stalking offenses that occur before a protection order is obtained.
- **74%** of the victims of simple stalking were the wife, common-law wife, or ex-wife of the offender. **14%** of the victims were the husband, common-law husband or ex-husband of the offender, **2%** were the son or daughter, **2%** were an in-law, and **8%** were other family.





Family Violence Total 2006-2010


- Family violence was indicated in **12%** of all violent offenses and **30%** of all simple assaults reported in Alabama from 2006 to 2010.
- **59%** of the victims of family violence were **female**: **41%** of the victims were the wife, common-law wife, ex-wife, mother, daughter, or sister of the offender. Other family members (aunts, uncles, nieces, nephews, cousins, grandchildren, etc) made up **22%** of the victims of family violence.
- **72%** of the victims of family violence simple assaults were **female**: **59%** of the victims were the wife, common-law wife, ex-wife, mother, daughter, or sister of the offender. Other family members (aunts, uncles, nieces, nephews, cousins, grandchildren, etc) made up **11%** of the victims of family violence simple assault.
- **Juveniles** made up **18%** of the family violence victims and **8%** of family violence simple assault victims. Juvenile represented the largest number of family violence rape victims with **55%**, and **one third** of all family violence rape victims were between the ages of 12 and 16 years old.
- Persons **over the age of 59** made up **5%** of the family violence victims and **5%** of family violence simple assault victims. Robbery was the family violence crime where persons over the age of 59 were most likely to be victims, with **15%** of all robbery victims in that age group.
- **46%** of family violence victims were related to the offender by marriage and **54%** were related by blood. **57%** of family violence simple assault victims were related to the offender by marriage and **43%** were related by blood.
- **70%** of family violence offenders and **69%** of simple assault family violence offenders were male. **8%** of family violence offenders and **9%** of family violence simple assault offenders were juveniles.
- Hands, fists or feet were the weapon used in **46%** of the family violence offenses, and in **88%** of family violence simple assaults. **42%** of family violence victims reported injuries, while **31%** of victims of family violence simple assault reported injuries.
- The majority of family violence offenses occurred at a residence: **85%** of all family violence offenses and **86%** of all family violence simple assaults.
- Stalking incidents represented **1%** of family violence aggravated assaults and **less than 1%** of family violence simple assaults.










Total Family Violence Trends - 2006-2010




Family Violence Victim Sex




Simple Assault Victim Sex




