

The Missing Link

TO LOST LOVED ONES

▶ Alabama's total population is 4,779,736 and 933,919 of those individuals are age 60 and older, according to the 2010 U.S. Census. (75,684 of those individuals are 85 and older.)

▶ Individuals with Down syndrome, autism and other cognitive issues are also prone to wandering.

▶ About 80,000 individuals in Alabama have Alzheimer's, but fewer than 1,000 of those individuals have received Project Lifesaver bracelets.

▶ Project Lifesaver is a program of specialized operations designed to locate missing individuals who have such conditions as Alzheimer's, Down syndrome and autism, individuals who are likely to wander and become lost.

▶ Each Project Lifesaver bracelet is \$300, and it will cost about \$400,000 annually to fund the project for the state of Alabama.
