

# Crime in Alabama

Crime in Alabama 2013 represents a summary of the nature and extent of the crimes reported by local criminal justice agencies to the Alabama Criminal Justice Information Center's (ACJIC) Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) program. State law mandates that all crimes are reported from state, county and local law enforcement agencies, and the statistics presented in this report are compiled from these reports.

Since the UCR program is designed to provide a snapshot of criminal activity in a specific geographical area rather than as a measure of a law enforcement agency's response to crime, it should not be used to evaluate or compare one agency with another. UCR is only one aspect of the activities and responsibilities of the law enforcement community, and the statistics presented herein are not intended to serve as the sole indicator of either the workload or effectiveness of the reporting agencies.

### Preface

The 2013 Crime in Alabama report is intended to inform law enforcement officials and private citizens of criminal and law enforcement activity in Alabama. Since the UCR offense and arrest data are the basis of this report, it must be noted that other factors affecting crime are not measured by UCR, such as age, sex, and race of the population, economic conditions of the area, transient population, culture, education, climate, attitudes of the victims toward crime and police, and crime reporting practices of the citizens. Therefore, it is difficult to draw conclusions or make valid comparisons between various jurisdictions by using only the crime and arrest data in this book. The data in this book are used for analyzing crime problems inherent in the criminal justice system and as a foundation for planning and budgeting. Geographic areas covered in this report include the State of Alabama, county and city strata.

We would like to extend our appreciation to law enforcement agencies – sheriff's departments, municipal police departments, and campus police – for their cooperation in the UCR program.

#### **PLEASE NOTE**

In 2013, the FBI UCR Program initiated collection of data under a new definition for forcible rape. The term "forcible" was removed, and the definition changed to "penetration, no matter how slight, of the vagina or anus with any body part or object, or oral penetration by a sex organ of another person, without the consent of the victim." Rape statistics found in this report are not an actual representation of comparative data from 2013 to 2012. The historical definition of rape, as defined in 2012 and previous years, indicate there was only a three percent increase in rape statewide during 2013. Because of this change, the number of reported rapes increased in 2013 compared to 2012. The crime rate for rape per 100,000 population decreased in 2013 compared to 2012, because it now includes both male and female population, where previously it included only the female population.

### Introduction

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In October of 1975, Act 872 passed both houses of the Alabama Legislature creating and establishing the Alabama Criminal Justice Information Center (ACJIC) which is commissioned to collect, store, retrieve, analyze, and disseminate criminal justice data. Inherent in ACJIC is a "uniform crime reporting system for the periodic collection and analysis of crimes reported to any and all criminal justice agencies within the state." (Act 872, Section 9, 1975)

With the passage of this bill, mandatory reporting was required of law enforcement agencies in Alabama. Prior to 1976, law enforcement agencies participated in the FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting Program (UCR) on a voluntary basis. Since mandatory submission, there has been a 185% increase in UCR reporting.

Alabama's UCR program functions in accordance with the FBI's standards of operation which specify a uniform data collection device and quality control procedures which provide viable crime statistics for accurate indication of crime and crime trends.

ACJIC implemented an incident based reporting system as an alternative to UCR summary reporting in 1977. This Incident Based Reporting (IBR) System also provides a self-contained internal record keeping system for the agency. IBR is a voluntary system with 99% of Alabama's agencies participating. This reporting program is more detailed providing greater potential for services, analyses, and resource studies by both the individual agency's crime analysis units and ACJIC.

In 1986, ACJIC organized a 32-person UCR Committee to review the IBR report forms. This committee was made up of law enforcement personnel from small, medium and large police departments and sheriff's departments, computerized agencies, the FBI, and the Bureau of Justice Statistics (BJS). The committee reviewed and analyzed the ten year old forms and decided that enhancements were needed. The IBR report forms were redesigned with input from Alabama's local agencies. In 2006, these forms were re-designed to conform to the FBI's Nation Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS). The new forms became the official state forms in 2010.

Alabama's law enforcement agencies are supplied with monthly reporting forms by ACJIC's Field Agents who are also made available to the reporting agencies to help answer any questions which may arise regarding forms, crime classifications, and clearance data. The Field Agents are also responsible for training law enforcement personnel and maintaining the quality of information for output to the criminal justice system. Agencies may also request free software from ACJIC to record and report incident/offense and arrest activities.

Alabama's law enforcement community can be proud of the progress made in the incident reporting program. Because of the support and dedication of our law enforcement Alabama is one of the states leading the way for a national IBR system.

### Crime and Arrest Data

Valid crime data can provide a solid foundation for statistical analyses, management-oriented analyses and crime breakdowns. These analyses can then aid local police departments in laying out patrol districts, assigning patrol units, and designating community education programs.

Data used in this report are provided by the Crime Statistics and Information (CSI) Division of the Alabama Criminal Justice Information Center (ACJIC). ACJIC's data center houses the official state repository for reported arrests and offenses, and the CSI Division has the responsibility of collecting and disseminating crime data. In 2013, approximately 350 agencies reported known offenses to Alabama's UCR; over 99% of Alabama's law enforcement agencies submitted Incident Reports.

Through a mandate of Congress, Arson is counted as a Part I Offense. So as not to distort crime trends in Total and Property Crime indices, Arson totals will not be included in these sections but will be included in a separate section following property crimes.

Crime data are obtained from the Part I Index of Offenses submitted by law enforcement agencies to Alabama's UCR program. These Part I Offenses are divided into Violent Crime and Property Crimes.

Violent Crimes include Homicide, Rape\*, Robbery, and Assault. These crimes are considered violent inasmuch as they are offenses perpetrated against a person(s) with a high risk or injury or death to the victim(s). Property Crimes are comprised of Burglary, Larceny, Motor Vehicle Theft, and Arson\*. Property or Nonviolent Crimes lack the aspect of force and/or bodily harm to the victim(s).

Clearance and arrest data are also reported to Alabama's UCR. A crime is considered cleared, either by arrest or by exceptional means, when enough evidence is found to charge a suspect and take him/her into custody. It is conceivable that one arrest could clear several offenses or that several arrests could clear one offense. The clearance rate is achieved by taking the number of clearances over the number of crimes reported:

### CLEARANCE RATE = <u>CLEARANCES</u> REPORTED CRIMES

This report is a composite picture of crime and law enforcement activity in Alabama for 2013. It provides a breakdown for the State and localities participating in the UCR program. The report concentrates on the Index Crime of the FBI's Part I Offenses and offers tabular and narrative formats for comparisons, trends, rates, and percent changes.

\*Prior to 2013, Rape included only female victims. In 2013 the definition of rape was expanded by the FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting Program to include male victims and other types of sexual assault offenses. Because of this change, the number of reported rapes increased in 2013 compared to 2012.

# Definition of Terms

Term	Definition
Adult	the UCR system defines adults as 18 years of age and over.
Arrest	a measure of law enforcement activity by which an individual is detained in legal custody.
Arson	willful or malicious burning with or without intent to defraud, includes attempts.
Assault	the unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe bodily injury, including attempts. Attempted homicide is listed as an aggravated assault.
Burglary	unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or theft.
Central City	a city with at least 50,000 residents.
City Strata	a breakdown of cities according to population.
Clearance	a measure of law enforcement activity which shows that a crime has been solved for a crime reporting purposes either by the arrest of a suspect or by exceptional means. Exceptional means provides a solution to a crime when there is enough evidence to place a formal charge against an offender, but some element beyond law enforcement control precludes an actual arrest. It is possible for one arrest to clear more than one offense.
Clearance Rate	the clearance rate is achieved by taking the number of clearances over the number of crimes reported.
Crime Rate	a measure of criminal activity which shows the number of crimes reported per 100,000 residents.
Criminal Activity	measured by reported crimes, trends, rates.
Forcible Entry	offenses in which force of any kind is used to unlawfully enter a structure for the purpose of committing a theft or felony.
Hierarchy of Offenses	whenever more than one offense is committed simultaneously, the most severe offense is reported to UCR. The exception is arson which is always reported along with the most serious offense.
Homicide	the willful killing of another as based on police investigation.
Incident Based Reporting (IBR) System	a voluntary crime reporting system developed by ACJIC as an alternative to the UCR Summary Program.
Juveniles	the UCR system defines juveniles as males and females 17 years of age and younger.
Larceny	unlawful taking or stealing of property or articles without the use of force, violence or fraud, i.e., pocket picking, purse snatching, shoplifting, theft from vending machines, etc.
Law Enforcement Activity	police activity as measured by clearances and arrests.
Minimal Injury	personal injury involving abrasions, minor lacerations requiring no more than usual first-aid treatment.

Motor Vehicles	automobiles, trucks, buses, motorcycles, etc.
Motor Vehicle Theft	The unlawful taking or stealing of a motor vehicle, including attempts.
Non-Residence	any structure used for purposes other than a residence.
Part I Index	a category of UCR offenses deemed more serious and/or most frequent.
Crimes	The Part I Index Crimes include homicide, rape*, robbery, aggravated
Gimes	assault, burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft, and arson.
Part II Offenses	a category of UCR offenses which include:

Recovery	finding stolen property. It should be noted that a recovered article does not clear a crime, although the owner is reunited with his property a crime was committed and a suspect must be taken into custody to clear the offense.
Reported Crimes	crimes reported to law enforcement officials. Note: In this report, only those offenses which prove to be actual offenses are used. Those cases which have been deemed unfounded are excluded from the crime totals.
Residence	any dwelling structure used for human habitation.
Robbery	stealing or taking anything from the care, custody, or control of a person, in his presence, by force or by threat of force, including attempts. Robbery is broken down into seven categories:  Highway: robberies occurring on the streets, in alleys, outside of structures.  Commercial House: hotels, motels, lodging houses, etc.  Gas or Service Stations: sell gasoline and related products.  Convenience Stores: neighborhood stores which specialize in the sale of consumable items.  Residence: robberies occurring in a dwelling or on the premises.  Banking Establishments - banks, savings & loan institutions, credit unions, etc.  Miscellaneous: churches, temples, schools, union halls, government buildings, public transit systems, etc.
Serious Injury	personal injury is considered serious if there are broken bones, internal injuries, or if stitches are required.
Uniform Crime Reports	standardized reporting forms used by law enforcement officials to report criminal activity within their jurisdiction.
Uniform Crime Reporting System	official state repository of the Uniform Crime Reports and Incident Reporting forms and provides for the collection and dissemination of crime data.
Unlawful Entry	involves no force and is achieved by use of an unlocked door or window. The element of trespass is essential.
Urbanized Areas	incorporated or unincorporated places of 2,500 or more inhabitants.
Violent Crimes	index crimes which are offenses perpetrated against a person (or persons) with a high risk of injury or death to the victim. Crimes included in this category are homicide, rape, robbery, and assault.

### Total Index Crime

Total Index Crime is comprised of the Part I Offenses: Homicide, Rape\*, Robbery, Assault, Burglary, Larceny, Motor Vehicle Theft, and Arson.\* Both offense and arrest data are collected for Part I crime.

### Alabama Crime - 2013 Summary Offense Data

- There were **173,916** crimes reported in 2013, a 4% decrease from 2012.
- The crime rate for the state was **3,598.0** per 100,000 inhabitants.
- On a daily average, there were 477 Part I offenses reported.
- The total property value stolen in 2013 was \$245,853,680; 13% was recovered.
- There were 237 Law Enforcement Officers assaulted in 2013. On the average, less than one officer was assaulted per day in 2013. 29% received serious injuries and 71% received minimal or no injuries.





### Clearance and Arrest Data


- There were **42,507** clearances in 2013, providing a clearance rate of **24%**.
- A total of **28,788** persons were arrested for Part I offenses.\* Part I arrests made up **17%** of all arrests in Alabama in 2013.
- Juveniles made up 10% of the Part I arrests, males made up 66% of persons arrested for Part I offenses, 45% of those arrested for Part I offenses were black and 55% were white.
- A total of **142,163** people were arrested for Part II offenses; **4%** of Part II arrests were juveniles. Males made up **73%** of Part II arrests. Whites made up **59%** and blacks, **41%** of Part II arrests.
- A total of 10,930 people were arrested for narcotic drug violations. 20% were for sale and 80% for possession. 97% were adult and 3% juvenile.
- There were 23,114 people arrested for alcohol violations: 45% were arrested for driving under the influence; 15% were arrested for liquor law violations; and 40% for public drunkenness. 97% of the alcohol arrests were adults and 3% were juveniles.



## Property Crime

Property Crime is comprised of Burglary, Larceny, Motor Vehicle Theft, and Arson.\* These crimes are designated as non-violent crimes because they lack the aspect of force and/or bodily harm to the victim(s).

### **Property Crime Summary 2013**

- In 2013 there were **153,694** property crimes reported. This is a **5**% decrease from 2012. Property crime makes up **88**% of the total Index offenses.
- The property crime rate was **3,179.6** per 100,000 inhabitants. On the average there were **421.1** property crimes reported per day.
- A total of **33,388** property crimes were cleared in 2013 for a **22%** clearance rate.
- In 2013, 22,677 people were arrested for property crimes: 89% were adults; 57% were white; and 62% were males.
- Total property value stolen in 2013 was \$245,853,680; 13% was recovered.



### Violent Crime

Violent Crime is comprised of Homicide, Rape\*, Robbery, and Assault. These crimes are designated as Violent Crimes because they are offenses perpetrated against a person (or persons) with a high risk of injury or death to the victim.

### **Violent Crime Summary 2013**


- There were **20,222** Violent Crimes reported in 2013, a **3%** decrease from 2012. Violent crime makes up **12%** of the total Index offenses.
- The violent crime rate was **418.4** per 100,000 inhabitants.
- On the average, there were **55.4** violent crimes reported per day.
- There were **9,119** violent crimes cleared in 2013 for a **45%** clearance rate.
- In 2013, **6,111** people were arrested for Violent Crimes: **93**% were adults; **44**% were white; and, **82**% were male.
- Prior to 2013, Rape included only female victims. In 2013 the definition of rape was expanded by the FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting Program to include

### Homicide

Murder and non-negligent manslaughter is the willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another. Not included in the count for this offense classification are deaths caused by negligence, suicide, accident, justifiable homicides which are the killings of felons by law enforcement officers in the line of duty or by private citizens; and attempts to murder or assaults to murder, which are scored as aggravated assaults.

- There were **342** homicides in Alabama in 2013 representing a **5**% increase from 2012.
- The homicide rate was 7.1 per 100,000 inhabitants, with an average of less than 1 homicide per day. 196 homicides were cleared for a 57% clearance rate.
- There were 233 persons arrested for homicide: 3% were juveniles; 86% were males; and 29% were white.
- The age group with the greatest number of homicide victims was 25-34, comprising 21% of the homicide victims. 36% had black victims and black offenders; 19% had white victims and white offender, 2% black victim and white offender, 3% white victim and black offender, and in 40%, the race of the offender was unknown.
- Handguns were used in 67% of all homicides, knives in 10%, hands, fists or feet in 4%, and other firearms, such as rifles and shotguns, in 4%.
- 22% of homicide victims were related to the offender, and 26% were acquainted with the offender. 8% of the victims were killed by strangers and in 44% the relationship was unknown. In 4% of all homicides the victim and offender were boyfriend/girlfriend, and 7% of all homicides were domestic in 2013.
- 26% of the homicides were a result of an argument, 16% of the homicides occurred during the commission of a felony, and in 53% of the homicides the circumstances were unknown.

Data reported in this publication represents rapes collected under the new definition used for 2013 reporting. Rape is the forcible sexual assault of a <u>male or female</u> victim, including attempts. The FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) program has expanded the definition of rape for reports submitted beginning in 2013 to include male <u>and</u> female victims and other forms of sexual assault. Prior to 2013, Rape was the forcible carnal knowledge of a female victim only, and did not include sodomy offenses.

- 1,978\* rapes were reported in Alabama in 2013. This is a 56%\* increase over 2012, due in part to an expanded definition of rape that began in 2013 that includes both male and female victims and certain other sexual assaults. Using the old 2012 definition of rape the number of reported rapes would have increased only 3% from the previous year.
- The rape rate was **41.0\*** per 100,000 inhabitants, both males and females.
- 826 rapes were cleared for a 42% clearance rate.
- On the average, there were **5.4** rapes reported per day in 2013.
- 231 persons were arrested for rape with 7% being juveniles. 54% of those arrested were white and 98% were male.
- 67% of the rape victims in Alabama were white; 30% were black, and 3% were other or unknown. 22% of all rape victims were 13, 14, 15, and 16-year-olds.
- In 79% of the rapes, the victim and offender knew or were related to each other; in 4% the victim and offender were strangers; and in 17% the relationship was unknown.
- 48% of the rapes involved a white victim and white offender; 10% a white victim and black offender; 25% a black victim and black offender; 2% a black victim and white offender. In 15% the race of the offender was unknown or other.
- In 79% of the rapes, hand, fists and/or verbal threats were used to exert force upon a victim; guns were used in 3%, and knives in 2% of the rapes.
- 76% of the rapes occurred in a residence; 5% in a highway, street or alley; 4% in a hotel or motel; and 3% in a field or woods.



### Robbery

Robbery is the stealing or taking anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person, in his presence, by force or by threat of force, includes attempts.

- There were **4,513** robberies reported in 2013, a **6%** decrease from 2012.
- The robbery rate was **93.4** per 100,000 inhabitants. On the average, there were **12.4** robberies reported per day in 2013.
- There were 1,683 robberies cleared for a 37% clearance rate.
- 1,264 persons were arrested for robbery: 13% were juveniles; 29% were white; and 86% were males.
- In 61% of the robberies a firearm was used; 27% were strong arm; in 5% a knife or cutting instrument was used; and in 7% other dangerous weapons were used.
- 19% occurred on a highway, street or in an alley; 28% at a residence; 13% in a parking lot; 9% at a convenience store; 13% in a parking lot or garage; 3% at a service station; and 2% at a bank.

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Assault is the unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe bodily injury, includes attempts.

- There were **13,389** aggravated assaults reported in 2013 for an **8%** decrease from 2012. In 2013 certain sexual assault offenses that were previously categorized as aggravated assault began being counted in the rape category.
- There were **277.0** assaults per 100,000 inhabitants. On the average, there were **36.7** assaults reported per day. **6,414** assaults were cleared for a **48%** clearance rate.
- **4,383** people were arrested for aggravated assaults in 2013: **6%** were juvenile, 79% were male and 48% were white.
- 33% of the assaults were a result of firearms; 19% other dangerous weapons;
   15% knives; and, 33% hands and fists.
- In 35% of the assaults the victim was a friend or acquaintance of the offender; in 17% the victim and offender were family; 5% were strangers; 15% were boyfriend/girlfriend; and in 28% the relationship was unknown.
- 63% occurred at a residence and 14% occurred on a street, highway, or alley. 5% occurred in a parking lot, 2% at a bar or nightclub, and 3% occurred at a school.

### Burglary

Burglary is the unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft, includes forcible entry, unlawful entry and attempted forcible entry.

- There were **40,183** burglaries reported in 2013, an **11%** decrease from 2012.
- There were **831.3** burglaries per 100,000 inhabitants. On the average, there were **110.1** burglaries reported per day.
- 5,846 burglaries were cleared for a 15% clearance rate.
- 4,018 persons were arrested for burglary: 12% juveniles; 87% males; and 53% white.
- 68% of the burglaries were forcible entry, 31% were unlawful entries, and 1% was attempted forcible entry. In 66% of burglaries the point of entry was a door; in 24% a window; and in 10% the point of entry was other.
- There were 31,684 residential burglaries with 58% being at night, and 42% during the day. There were 8,499 non-residential burglaries with 50% being at night, and 50% during the day.

### Larceny

Larceny is the unlawful taking or stealing of property or articles without the use of force, violence and fraud.

- 103,465 larcenies were reported in 2013 for a 3% decrease from 2012.
- The larceny rate was **2,140.5** per 100,000 inhabitants.
- 25,238 larcenies were cleared for a 24% clearance rate. On the average, there were 283.5 larcenies reported per day.
- There were **17,907** persons arrested for larceny in 2013: **10%** were juveniles; **55%** were males, and **58%** were white.
- 17% of the larcenies were thefts of items from motor vehicles; 16% were shoplifting, and 5% were theft of items from buildings.
- The value of total property stolen in larcenies was \$123,685,716, or an average of \$1,195 per incident.

## Motor Vehicle Theft

Motor Vehicle Theft is the unlawful taking or stealing of a motor vehicle, includes attempts.

- There were **10,046** motor vehicle thefts reported in 2013 for a **9**% increase over 2012.
- The motor vehicle theft rate for Alabama in 2013 was **207.8** thefts for every 100,000 inhabitants. On the average, there were **27.5** motor vehicles stolen per day.
- A total of 2,304 motor vehicle thefts were cleared for a clearance rate of 23%.
- A total of **752** people were arrested in 2013 for motor vehicle theft: **12%** were juveniles; **80%** were males; and, **65%** were white.
- The dollar value resulting from locally stolen motor vehicles was \$58,346,117. The value recovered was \$20,654,536 or 35%.
- 38% of motor vehicle thefts occurred at a residence.

It should be noted that the hierarchy rule does not apply to arson, meaning that any offense(s) committed in conjunction with arson results in the most serious offense, as well as the arson incident, being reported to UCR.


- A total of **927** arsons were reported in 2013. This represents a **1%** increase from 2012. **53%** were structural arsons, **21%** were motor vehicles and other mobile property, and **26%** were other.
- There were **165** arsons cleared in 2013 for an **18%** clearance rate.
- On the average, there were **2.5** arsons reported per day.
- There were 121 people arrested for arson: 9% were juveniles; 77% were males; and 58% were white.
- In **5**% of the structural arsons, the building was uninhabited or not normally in use.
- The total value of property damaged or destroyed by arson amounted to \$12,666,227. Structural arsons amounted to \$10,839,609 for an average of \$22,032 per incident. Arson of mobile property amounted to \$1,119,296 in damages for an average of \$5,740 per incident. Arson of other property caused \$707,322 in damages for an average of \$2,947 per incident.
















### Part II Arrest Data


- A total of **142,163** persons were arrested in Alabama in 2013 for Part II offenses (includes arson arrests).
- This is a decrease of 6% from 2012's figure of 151,828.
- 59% of Part II arrestees were white and 41% were black.
- 96% of the Part II arrests were adults.
- Males made up 73% of Part II arrests.
- Liquor violations (DUI, drunkenness, liquor laws violations) made up 16% of the Part II arrests. Narcotics violations made up 8% of the Part II arrests.

#### **Liquor Violations**

- There were **23,114** people arrested for alcohol violations in 2013.
- 10,472 people were arrested for DUI with 99% being 18 and over. 76% of the DUI arrests were males, 73% of DUI arrests were white.
- There were **3,482** people arrested for liquor laws violations (bootlegging, buying or selling to minors, etc.) **14%** were juveniles, **74%** were males and **79%** were white.
- There were **9,160** people arrested in 2013 for public drunkenness. **1%** were iuveniles, **80%** were males and **72%** were white.

#### **Drug Abuse Violations**

Drug abuse violations involve the illegal sale, possession, manufacture, use, cultivation, etc. of narcotic and non-narcotic drugs.

#### Illegal drugs are divided into four categories:

- 1. Opium or cocaine and their derivatives such as morphine, heroin, codeine, and "crack".
- 2. Marijuana.
- 3. Synthetic narcotics which are manufactured narcotics which cause true drug addiction such as demerol and methadone.
- 4. Dangerous non-narcotic drugs which include barbiturates, amphetamines and methamphetamine.
- There were **10,930** persons arrested for drug violations, **20%** were for sale of drugs and **80%** were for possession.
- 3% of the drug arrests were juveniles, 77% were males and 56% were white.
- Marijuana possession resulted in the greatest number of arrests for drug violations, 3,233 for 30% of the drug arrests. Possession of cocaine resulted in 2,016 arrests, or 19% of all drug arrests.







Full Time University Police Department Personnel



# Officers Killed or Assaulted

#### Killed

In 2013, no full-time, sworn law enforcement officers were killed due to a felonious act in the line of duty in Alabama. **Three** officers died in accidents while on duty.

.....

September 17, 2013	An officer with the Orange Beach Police Department died in an automobile accident while on duty.
November 10, 2013	An officer with the Phenix City Police Department died from an accidental gunshot to his leg while on duty.
December 30, 2013	An officer with the Centre Police Department died in an automobile accident while on duty.

#### Assaulted

In 2013 there were 237 law enforcement officers assaulted in the line of duty. 69 officers, or 29%, received serious injuries. The remainder received minimal or no injuries.


Hands, fists or feet were used in 189 assaults or 80% of the incidents. Firearms were used in 3 cases or 1%.

All other arrests was the most dangerous police activity, resulting in 22% of the assaults. The next most dangerous activity was responding to a disturbance call, resulting in 18% of the assaults.

82% of the assaults on police officers were cleared.



## Appendix C

Appendix C contains Part I offense data reported by individual city police departments, county sheriff's offices, and university police departments. City data is presented first and reflects percent increase or decrease over the prior year, followed by a section with clearance data. County sheriff's departments follow the section on City data, and also reflect percent increase or decrease over prior year and clearance data.

## City Data

Alabama's cities will include incorporated and unincorporated areas grouped by population strata.

The tables on the following pages group cities according to population and list city names alphabetically. The percent change is the increase or decrease in reported crime over 2012. The numbers in parentheses indicate the number of months the agency reported to UCR if less than twelve months.

This report does not try to account for factors which contribute to the number and type of crime in a particular area, i.e., age, sex, race of population, transients, climate, employment, etc. Any effort to make crime comparisons between one area and another should be limited in scope and acknowledge the existence of these various factors impacting the incidence of crime.

Prior to 2013, Rape included only female victims. In 2013 the definition of rape was expanded by the FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting Program to include male victims and other types of sexual assault offenses. Because of this change, the number of reported rapes increased in 2013 compared to 2012.

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## Clearance Rates

A clearance is a measure of law enforcement activity whereby enough evidence is found to charge a suspect and take him into custody (an arrest) or when a crime is solved but no formal charges are brought against a suspect (clearance by exceptional means). The clearance rate is achieved by taking the number of offenses and dividing that number into the number of clearances.

## <u>CLEARANCES</u> = CLEARANCE RATE REPORTED OFFENSES

It is important to note that clearance data is reported on a monthly basis to UCR and therefore it is possible for an arrest made in one month to clear a crime committed in previous months or years.

Prior to 2013, Rape included only female victims. In 2013 the definition of rape was Expanded by the FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting Program to include male victims and other types of sexual assault offenses. Because of this change, the number of reported rapes increased in 2013 compared to 2012.

Incorporated and unincorporated areas not having a municipal police department are protected by the county sheriff and are included in his jurisdiction. Since UCR data deals with criminal activity in a particular geographic rather than with law enforcement agencies' activities, we do not intend, nor recommend, that this data be used to evaluate or compare one agency with another.

Due to diverse demographic characteristics, the county data will be presented in alphabetical order rather than by population strata. It will include reported crime and clearance data submitted by Alabama's 67 county sheriffs. County data does not include crime data submitted by municipal police departments contained within the county boundaries. The numbers in parentheses on the following pages denote the number of months the agency reported to UCR if it was less than twelve.

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## Clearance Rates

A clearance is a measure of law enforcement activity whereby enough evidence is found to charge a suspect and take him into custody (an arrest) or when a crime is solved but no formal charges are brought against a suspect (clearance by exceptional means). The clearance rate is achieved by taking the number of offenses and dividing that number into the number of clearances.

It is important to note that clearance data is reported on a monthly basis to UCR and therefore it is possible for an arrest made in one month to clear a crime committed in previous months or years.
