This report was produced by the Statistical Analysis Center of the Alabama Criminal Justice Information Center. Data presented in this report was provided by the Uniform Crime Reporting Division of ACJIC for the calendar year of 2003. For purposes of this report a juvenile is defined as a person 17 years of age or younger.

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# Juvenile Victims of Violent Crime 2003

In the 18,602 violent offenses\* reported in 2003, 13% of the victims were juveniles. There were 2,390 juvenile victims: 14 juvenile homicide victims; 704 juvenile rape victims; 273 juvenile robbery victims; and 1,399 juvenile victims of aggravated assault.

There were 9,442 juvenile victims of simple assault, which represent 12% of all victims of simple assaults reported in 2003.

46% of the victims were males, and 54% were females. 56% of the victims were black, and 44% were white.

A firearm was the weapon used in 19% of the offenses; hands, fists, or feet were used as a weapon in 54%; a knife was the weapon used in 6%; and other dangerous weapons were used in 21%.

37% of the victims suffered injuries: 12% were injured with a firearm; 9% were injured with a knife; 52% were injured with fists, feet or hands; and 27% were injured with other dangerous weapons.

67% of the victims were acquainted with or related to the offender; 10% of the offenders were strangers; and in 23% of the offenses the offender was unknown. In 29% of the offenses, the offender was also a juvenile.

53% of the offenses occurred at a residence; 18% occurred in a street or alley; 6% occurred at a school; 5% occurred in a parking lot; and 18% occurred in other locations.

# Juvenile Victims of Assault 2003

## Aggravated

There were 1,399 juvenile assault victims in 2003, representing 13% of all victims of the 10,966 aggravated assaults reported in Alabama for that year. 62% of the victims were males, and 38% were females. 61% of the victims were black, and 39% were white.

A firearm was the weapon used in 20% of the assaults; hands, fists, or feet were used as a weapon in 44%; a knife was the weapon used in 10%; and other dangerous weapons were used in 26%.

46% of the victims were injured: 14% with a firearm; 11% with a knife; 41% with fists, feet or hands; and 34% with other dangerous weapons

74% of the victims were acquainted with or related to the offender; 9% of the offenders were strangers; and in 17% of the assaults the offender was unknown. In 36% of the assaults the offender was also a juvenile.

52% of the assaults occurred at a residence; 20% occurred in a street or alley; 9% occurred at a school; and 19% occurred in other locations.

## Simple

There were 9,442 juvenile victims of simple assault in 2003, or 12% of all victims of simple assaults for that year. 51% of the victims were females and 49% were males; 53% were black and 47% were white.

79% of the victims were acquainted with or related to the offender; 5% were strangers; and in 16% of the offenses the offender was unknown.

# Juvenile Victims of Homicide 2003

There were 14 juvenile homicide victims in 2003, representing 5% of the victims of the 297 homicides reported in Alabama for that year. Four juveniles died as a result of child abuse, and 4 juveniles were killed by another juvenile.

64% of the victims were males, and 36% were females. 79% of the victims were black, and 21% were white.

A firearm was the weapon used in 43% of the homicides; hands, fists, or feet were used as a weapon in 36%; a knife was the weapon used in 14%; and other dangerous weapons were used in 7%.

In 43% of the homicides the victim was related to or acquainted with the offender; in 14% the victim and offender were strangers; and in 43% the offender was unknown.

71% of the homicides occurred at a residence; 14% occurred in a street or alley; and 15% occurred in other locations.

In 29% of the homicides the offender was also a juvenile.

# Juvenile Victims of Robbery 2003

There were 5,778 robberies reported in 2003, and 273 juveniles were robbery victims, representing 5% of all robbery victims in Alabama for that year. 50% of the victims were black and 50% were white; 85% were males, and 15% were females.

A firearm was the weapon used in 52% of the robberies; hands, fists, or feet were used as a weapon in 37%; a knife was the weapon used in 3%; and other dangerous weapons were used in 8%.

16% of the victims suffered injuries: 16% were injured with a firearm; 0% were injured with a knife; 74% were injured with fists, feet or hands; and 10% were injured with other dangerous weapons.

30% of the victims were acquainted with or related to the offender; 25% of the offenders were strangers; and in 45% of the offenses the offender was unknown.

14% of the offenses occurred at a residence; 43% occurred in a street or alley; 4% occurred at a school; 11% occurred in a parking lot; 4% occurred at a store; and 24% occurred in other locations.

In 26% of the robberies, the offender was also a juvenile.

## **Juvenile Victims of Rape 2003**

There were 704 juvenile female rape victims in 2003, representing 45% of the 1,561 rapes reported in Alabama for that year. 49 juvenile victims were 10 years of age or younger. 53% of the victims were black females and 47% were white females.

A firearm was the weapon used in 2% of the rapes; hands, fists, or feet were used as a weapon in 81%; a knife was the weapon used in 1%; and unknown weapons were used in 16%.

26% of the victims suffered injuries: 1% were injured with a firearm; 2% were injured with a knife; 91% were injured with fists, feet or hands; and 6% were injured with other dangerous weapons.

72% of the victims were acquainted with or related to the offender; 6% of the offenders were strangers; and in 22% of the rapes the offender was unknown.

70% of the offenses occurred at a residence; 4% occurred in a street or alley; 1% occurred at a school; and 25% occurred in other locations.

In 16% of the rapes the offender was also a juvenile.
