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

Juvenile Victims of Violent Crime


- Of the **20,863** violent offenses* reported in 2012, **11%** of the victims were juveniles. There were **2,253** juvenile victims: **21** juvenile homicide victims; **458** juvenile rape victims; **196** juvenile robbery victims; and **1,578** juvenile victims of aggravated assault.
- There were **7,461** juvenile victims of simple assault, representing **9%** of all victims of simple assaults reported in 2012.
- 42% of the victims were males, and 58% were females. 42% of the victims were black, and 58% were white.
- A firearm was the weapon used in 13% of the offenses; hands, fists, or feet were used as a weapon in 65%; a knife was the weapon used in 6%; and other dangerous weapons were used in 16%.
- 78% of the victims were acquainted with or related to the offender; 3% of the offenders were strangers; and in 19% of the offenses the offender was unknown.
- 64% of the offenses occurred at a residence; 13% occurred in a street or alley; 7% occurred at a school; 3% occurred in a parking lot; and 13% occurred in other locations.

Juvenile Victims of Assault

Aggravated


- There were **1,578** juvenile assault victims in 2012, representing **11%** of all victims of the **14,479** aggravated assaults reported in Alabama for that year. **48%** of the victims were males, and **52%** were females. **43%** of the victims were black, and **57%** were white.
- A firearm was the weapon used in 10% of the assaults; hands, fists, or feet were used as a weapon in 63%; a knife was the weapon used in 7%; and other dangerous weapons were used in 20%.
- 82% of the victims were acquainted with or related to the offender; 2% of the offenders were strangers; and in 16% of the assaults the offender was unknown.
- 65% of the assaults occurred at a residence; 12% occurred in a street or alley; 8% occurred at a school; and 15% occurred in other locations.

Simple

- There were **7,461** juvenile victims of simple assault in 2012, or **9%** of all victims of simple assaults for that year. **51%** of the victims were females and **49%** were males; **45%** were black and **55%** were white.
- 85% of the victims were acquainted with or related to the offender; 2% were strangers; and in 13% of the offenses the offender was unknown.
 - By definition, a simple assault is an assault which did not involve the use of a firearm, knife, cutting instrument or other dangerous weapon and in which the victim did not sustain serious or aggravated injuries.




Juvenile Victims of Homicide

- There were **21** juvenile homicide victims in 2012, representing **7%** of the victims of the **311** homicides reported in Alabama for that year.
- 57% of the victims were males, and 43% were females. 52% of the victims were black, and 48% were white.
- A firearm was the weapon used in 52% of the homicides; hands, fists, or feet were used as a weapon in 10%; a knife was the weapon used in 5%; and other dangerous weapons were used in 33%.
- In 62% of the homicides the victim was related to or acquainted with the offender; in 5% the victim and offender were strangers; and in 33% the offender was unknown.
- 48% of the homicides occurred at a residence; 29% occurred in a street or alley; and 23% occurred in other locations.




Juvenile Victims of Robbery

- There were **4,795** robberies reported in 2012, and **196** juveniles were robbery victims, representing **3%** of all robbery victims in Alabama for that year.
- 54% of the victims were black and 46% were white; 78% were males, and 22% were females.
- A firearm was the weapon used in 45% of the robberies; hands, fists, or feet were used as a weapon in 44%; a knife was the weapon used in 7%; and other dangerous weapons were used in 4%.
- 37% of the victims were acquainted with or related to the offender; 13% of the offenders were strangers; and in 50% of the offenses the offender was unknown.
- 18% of the offenses occurred at a residence; 35% occurred in a street or alley; 6% occurred at a school; 11% occurred in a parking lot; 11% occurred in a parking lot; and 19% occurred in other locations.




Juvenile Victims of Rape

- There were **458** juvenile female rape victims in 2012, representing **36%** of the **1,264** rapes reported in Alabama for that year.
- 47 juvenile victims were 10 years of age or younger. 36% of the victims were black females and 64% were white females.
- A firearm was the weapon used in 1% of the rapes; hands, fists, or feet were used as a weapon in 83%; a knife was the weapon used in 1%; and unknown weapons were used in 15%.
- 84% of the victims were acquainted with or related to the offender; 2% of the offenders were strangers; and in 14% of the rapes the offender was unknown.
- 79% of the offenses occurred at a residence; 4% occurred in a street or alley; 4% occurred at a school; and 13% occurred in other locations.
