
The Alabama Law Enforcement Agency (ALEA) was created by Act 2013-67 and represents the consolidation and realignment of 12 state law enforcement agencies/functions into one entity. ALEA is responsible for the functions and missions of the Alabama Department of Homeland Security, Department of Public Safety, Alabama Bureau of Investigation, Fusion Center, Criminal Justice Information Center, Marine Police, Alcoholic Beverage Control Board Enforcement, Department of Revenue Enforcement, Forestry Commission Investigations, Agricultural and Industry Investigations, Public Service Commission Enforcement, and Office of Prosecution Service Computer Forensics Lab.

## Juvenile Victims of Violent Crime

- Of the **19,628** violent offenses\* reported in 2014, **11%** of the victims were juveniles. There were **2,126** juvenile victims: **15** juvenile homicide victims; **893** juvenile rape victims; **218** juvenile robbery victims; and **1,000** juvenile victims of aggravated assault.
- There were **6,446** juvenile victims of simple assault, representing **8%** of all victims of simple assaults reported in 2014.
- 45% of the victims were males, and 55% were females. 47% of the victims were black, and 53% were white.
- A firearm was the weapon used in 17% of the offenses; hands, fists, or feet were used as a weapon in 59%; a knife was the weapon used in 5%; and other dangerous weapons were used in 19%.
- 77% of the victims were acquainted with or related to the offender; 4% of the offenders were strangers; and in 19% of the offenses the offender was unknown.
- 63% of the offenses occurred at a residence; 13% occurred in a street or alley; 7% occurred at a school; 3% occurred in a parking lot; and 14% occurred in other locations.



# Juvenile Victims of Homicide

- There were **15** juvenile homicide victims in 2014, representing **6%** of the victims of the **270** homicides reported in Alabama for that year.
- 87% of the victims were males, and 13% were females. 53% of the victims were black, and 47% were white.
- A firearm was the weapon used in 33% of the homicides; hands, fists, or feet were used as a weapon in 33%; a knife was the weapon used in 0%; and other dangerous weapons were used in 34%.
- In 67% of the homicides the victim was related to or acquainted with the offender; in 0% the victim and offender were strangers; and in 33% the offender was unknown.
- 53% of the homicides occurred at a residence; 27% occurred in a street or alley; and 20% occurred in other locations.


# Juvenile Victims of Rape\*

- There were **893** juvenile female rape victims in 2014, representing **47%** of the **1,890** rapes reported in Alabama for that year.
- 288 juvenile victims were 10 years of age or younger. 85% of the victims were females and 15% were males. 67% were white and 33% were black.
- A firearm was the weapon used in 1% of the rapes; hands, fists, or feet were used as a weapon in 82%; a knife was the weapon used in 1%; and unknown weapons were used in 16%.
- 90% of the victims were acquainted with or related to the offender; 1% of the offenders were strangers; and in 9% of the rapes the offender was unknown.
- 83% of the offenses occurred at a residence; 2% occurred in a street or alley; 3% occurred at a school; and 12% occurred in other locations.

\*Prior to 2013, Rape included only <u>female</u> victims. In 2013 the definition of rape was expanded by the FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting Program to include male victims and other types of sexual assault offenses. Because of this change, the number of reported rapes increased in 2014 compared to 2012.




# **Juvenile Victims of Robbery**

- There were **4,481** robberies reported in 2014, and **218** juveniles were robbery victims, representing **5%** of all robbery victims in Alabama for that year.
- 72% of the victims were black and 28% were white; 84% were males, and 16% were females.
- A firearm was the weapon used in 52% of the robberies; hands, fists, or feet were used as a weapon in 39%; a knife was the weapon used in 3%; and other dangerous weapons were used in 6%.
- 31% of the victims were acquainted with or related to the offender; 17% of the offenders were strangers; and in 52% of the offenses the offender was unknown.
- 18% of the offenses occurred at a residence; 44% occurred in a street or alley; 8% occurred at a school; 9% occurred in a parking lot; 1% occurred in a park or playground; and 20% occurred in other locations.

#### **Juvenile Victims of Assault**

### Aggravated

- There were **1,000** juvenile assault victims in 2014, representing **8%** of all victims of the **12,987** aggravated assaults reported in Alabama for that year. **62%** of the victims were males, and **38%** were females. **52%** of the victims were black, and **48%** were white.
- A firearm was the weapon used in 23% of the assaults; hands, fists, or feet were used as a weapon in 42%; a knife was the weapon used in 9%; and other dangerous weapons were used in 26%.
- 77% of the victims were acquainted with or related to the offender; 2% of the offenders were strangers; and in 21% of the assaults the offender was unknown.
- 56% of the assaults occurred at a residence; 16% occurred in a street or alley; 11% occurred at a school; and 17% occurred in other locations.


### Simple

- There were **6,446** juvenile victims of simple assault in 2014, or **8%** of all victims of simple assaults for that year. **51%** of the victims were females and **49%** were males; **50%** were black and **50%** were white.
- 84% of the victims were acquainted with or related to the offender; 2% were strangers; and in 14% of the offenses the offender was unknown.

By definition, a simple assault is an assault which did not involve the use of a firearm, knife, cutting instrument or other dangerous weapon and in which the victim did not sustain serious or aggravated injuries.
